Parents and children participated in a variety of hands-on, educational activities that incorporated some of the science and STEM ethics that are inspired by Mary Shelley's "Frankenstein."

The program took place on the third floor of the Princeton Public Library, with close to 100 members of the community in attendance over the course of the two-hour event. Many modules from the NSF funded NISEnet were incorporated into the Frankenstein activities.

This year, attendees enjoyed STEM stations like Frankentoy, Scribble Bot, Monster Mask, and Battery Stacks, among others. Children and adults alike had the opportunity to construct their own monstrous creations and materials science and engineering related activities.
